

ED SMITH STADIUM HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

Pod Seating- Graduation tickets will be distributed in “pods” to support physical distancing between groups. Please refrain from moving to other seats or joining other groups.

Leave Your Bags At Home- Bags will be prohibited in Ed Smith Stadium, with the exception of medically necessary items including diaper bags. Clutch purses no larger than 5” x 7” will be allowed.

Stay Home If You Are Feeling Sick

No Outside Food & Beverage- Limited concessions will be open for purchase of water and soft drinks only. Concession stands are card only. No cash will be accepted.

Practice Social Distancing- Maintain physical distance of at least six (6) feet at all times, including in the parking lots.

Wear Your Mask- Face coverings must be worn properly in all areas of Ed Smith Stadium including parking lots and entry lines into the ballpark. Masks with exhalation valves and gaiters are not permitted.

Wash Your Hands- Frequently wash your hands and use hand sanitizer stations located throughout the stadium.

Parking- Students and faculty will park in the East Lot located off Tuttle Ave and 12th Street. Guests will be able to park in the North Lot and Preferred Lot off 12th Street and Springfield Ave. Entrances to both the North Lot and Preferred Lot are off Springfield Ave. Maps are attached for reference. Directions can also be found below.

Gates- Gates will open one hour prior to graduation for guests. Students will be able to enter the stadium an hour and a half before the start of graduation. Guests will be permitted to enter through the Left Field Gate (located in the East Lot off Tuttle Ave and 12th St.) and Home Plate Gate (off of Euclid Ave and 12th St.). Remember to have your ticket ready to help speed up the entry into the stadium. When exiting the stadium, all guests should leave in an orderly fashion and maintain a physical distance (at least six feet) from others.

FAN HEALTH PROMISE

All ticketholders must agree to the terms and conditions set forth at <https://www.mlb.com/orioles/tickets/ticketback> which require, in part, that neither ticketholders, accompanying minor(s) nor other accompanying parties may attend the game if within fourteen (14) days preceding the game, they have:

(1) tested positive or presumptively positive for COVID-19 or other Communicable Disease or been identified as a potential carrier of COVID-19 or other Communicable Disease; OR

(2) experienced any symptoms commonly associated with COVID-19 or other Communicable Disease (e.g., a fever of 100.4°F or higher, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain/achiness, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, nasal congestion, runny nose, vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, or any other symptoms associated with COVID-19 identified by the CDC); OR

(3) been in close contact as defined by the CDC (15 or more minutes in a 24-hour period regardless of mask wearing by either person) with any person who is confirmed or suspected of being infected with COVID-19 or other Communicable Disease.

Please note: According to the CDC, older adults and people of any age with serious underlying medical conditions may be at higher risk of death or severe illness from COVID-19. All guests should evaluate their risk in determining whether to attend a game.

To help maintain physical distancing guidelines, ticketholders must also agree that they will not sell, transfer, or otherwise provide any of their graduation tickets to anyone other than family with whom they have been sheltering (or other trusted acquaintances), unless selling, transferring, or otherwise providing all such tickets (i.e., the full pod of tickets) to one party.
